

Public Health Nutrition and RDNs Now & In the Future



Current Status

- About 11% of RDNs currently report that there primary practice area is community nutrition
- The average age of all CDR-credentialed dietetics practitioners: 44 years (2010)
- The median age of all CDR-credentialed dietetics practitioners: 46 years (2014)
- The annual growth rate of supply of CDRcredentialed dietetics practitioners declined from 3% in the early 1990s to 1.5% in 2010





Future Demand

With the passage of the Affordable Care Act, a worldwide increase in obesity and chronic disease, and a global emphasis on preventative health care that includes behavioral, environmental, and policy interventions, the

demand for registered dietitian nutritionists (RDNs) with unique expertise in public health and community nutrition (PHCN) is increasing.





Recommended Staffing Ratio

To meet the recommended staffing ratio of 1 public health nutritionist per 50,000 people there is an immediate need for a 113% increase in the workforce





Main Points

- 1. Aging workforce
- 2. Growing demand for public health/community RDNs
- 3. Fewer RDNs entering the field than in years past
